Message from Pastor Greg: Summertime

But everything exposed by the light becomes visible—and everything that is illuminated becomes a light. This is why it is said: "Wake up, sleeper. Rise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you." Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity, because the days [without God] are evil. Ephesians 5:13-16

Are we "making the most of every opportunity," as Paul counsels in his letter to the Church in Ephesus? He's an incredible writer. His "life message" that comes through in all he writes is this: God has made us stewards of the land we think we own...we don't own it, we hold it in trust. What's on your Summer reading list?

Prayer. I'm going to keep harping on this one, because the Spirit of God has finally driven home in my thinking, and more and more in my habits, what a privilege we have in being able to talk with God any time we want. Listening prayer...prayer that orients our thoughts and feelings towards our Creator and Redeemer... prayer that squarely asks for God's help in carrying burdens we can't carry. Here's another of my photos that is more interesting than lovely. Instead of taking this one while I was out on a lovely nature walk, I took it in a parking lot. When I was teaching in Prague, my university had trouble getting me a work visa and asked me, somewhat sheepishly, if I could live with being illegal. There seemed to be no alternative, so I agreed. At the time, the Czech Republic was not a member of the newly created European Union. Accordingly, once a month I needed a new entry date on my passport, so would take the train to Dresden, have a nice lunch, and then return.



The location and date of the photo are important. This is Dresden, Germany, in the 1990s. History buffs know that in 1945, bombing devastated Dresden, including the beautiful Lutheran Frauenkirche. The church, built between 1726 and 1743, was a prime example of Baroque architecture, until World War II bombing reduced it to rubble. This photo shows thousands of stones neatly sorted and stacked on metal racks in the parking lot, awaiting the reconstruction of the church, which was not completed until 2005. How startling that the damage took so long to repair, and what a stark reminder how long it can take to undo the damage done by the evils we humans can wreak.

In today's tumultuous world, it's easy to feel beset by evil from all sides. Christians often wonder why God allows evil to persist. Sorry, I don't have an answer to that age-old question. But, as usual, we can go to Scripture for insight and comfort. Most Old Testament prophets considered their role to be conveying God's word to the people. In contrast, Habakkuk questions God about an issue many Christians do today: why does God permit evil to (seemingly) thrive? Habakkuk writes:

Oh Lord, how long shall I cry, And You will not hear? (Habakkuk 1:2)

God does answer, as He will answer us. As usual, however, His answer doesn't always come immediately:

For the vision is for an appointed time; But at the end it will speak, and it will not lie. Though it tarries, wait for it; Because it will surely come It will not tarry. (Habakkuk 2:3)

Just now our world is full of turmoil, and evil seems distressingly widespread. As Christians we have faith that God will act, but we know He will act only when He feels the time is right. All I know to do is pray for His mercy to those whose lives have been damaged by the evils of today's world, for evildoers to hear His voice, and for patience for us to stay strong in the faith.

Do You Want to Go on the 2026 Guatemala Mission Trip?

Still thinking about joining the Guatemala Mission Team for March 2026? **The dates for the trip will be March 7-18**, **2026**. Applications can be submitted now with **the final deadline on September 5th** along with a deposit (details below). This will hold your spot in the group (6-15 people).

Applications can be filled out online at the www.hopeofpokomchi.org website and then printed out (the "Medical Condition" section doesn't work correctly so that needs to be filled out by hand after printing the application). Also, the section on COVID vaccinations is no longer required. On the website, click on: Help Change Lives, Team Trips, Download, Application Forms. Print off your application, attach a deposit of \$100 (individual) or \$200 (family) made out to "CPC Mission Fund" and drop off your application and deposit at the church or give to Nina or Gary Buma. The deadline again is September 5. If you have any questions, contact Team Leaders: Gary Buma (360-734-8733) or Nina Buma (360-319-1706) gnbuma@hotmail.com.

We already have a great group rate for round trip airfare (\$500) for the first 12 people who sign up. In order to get this rate, we need a minimum of 10 people to commit to this trip.

Each person who commits to going will have a personal cost of approximately \$1500, but it will be less depending on the amount of fundraising that we do. The CPC Mission Committee will help with such things as the cost of the project materials we will use in Guatemala (approximately 1/3 of the cost), and the mission trip members will be doing some fundraising which helps with their individual costs. We've already had one fundraiser last April (sold Butter Braids) and raised about \$400. Our next fundraiser will be in early December selling Christmas swags, wreaths, and greenery centerpieces. Those who have committed to going on the mission are expected to help out with these fundraisers. We also welcome anyone else to join in the fun even if you can't go to Guatemala! If you have any great fundraising ideas, let us know!

A couple of anonymous donors have graciously offered to sponsor 2-3 people who would like to go on this mission trip but can't afford it (partially or fully). If you'd like to inquire about this, attach a note on your application when you submit it.

We are thankful that another team will be sent to Guatemala and would appreciate your prayers for the core group of people who are committed and eager to continue with their planning and fundraising, as well as, the entire team that God calls to Guatemala.

Remembering Frank Monroe Phillips

Frank Monroe Phillips, 88 of Bellingham, WA, passed away peacefully on May 24th, 2025, surrounded by his family, after years of battling cancer, diabetes, and kidney failure.

Frank was born on March 19th, 1937, to Henry and Margaret Phillips in Seattle, WA. He was the oldest of 8 children. He stopped attending school in the 9th grade so he could bring income into the family home. He then went on to enlist in the Marines in 1955 and acquired his GED. He was in the Air Wing as a Staff Sergeant Radar Operator, which led to his lifelong profession as an Air Traffic Controller. He retired from the Bellingham Airport at 76 years old after 46 years of service as an Air Traffic Controller.

Frank and his first wife had 4 children together - Tahni, Troy, Travis, and Todd. He met his wife Vicki in early January, 1981, and they were happily married on July 7th, 1981. Frank helped raise her 2 daughters — Rikka and Darcy. He has 17 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren. He loved his family deeply and would attend their sporting events and school programs as often as he could.

Frank had several hobbies which included any and all airplanes; he built model airplanes and made airplane bicycles from scratch. He loved his John Wayne collection. He also built detailed, tiny, miniature homes. He loved taking his kids and grandkids hunting and fishing. He loved going bowling and LOVED THE SEAHAWKS and any team that played the Broncos! He was a strong patriot and loved the military and his country.

He meant the world to our family and will be deeply missed! He is legendary to all of us!

He is preceded in death by his parents Henry and Margaret Phillips, sibling Norma Ozimek, son Todd Phillips, grandchildren Dustin Wilson, Adam Lavine, and Destiny Phillips.

He is survived by his wife of 44 years Vicki Phillips; siblings James Phillips, Robert Phillips, Mary Silverio, Henry Phillips, Shirley Silverio, and Rose Borinette; children Tahni Phillips (Napoleon), Troy Phillips (Teresa), and Travis and Darcy Long; 14 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren.
